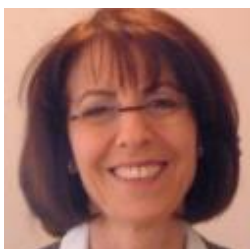
Mr. Minta Aboagye is a hydrologist and a water resources engineer. He was formerly the Director of Water at the Ministry of Water Resources, Works and Housing. He has played key roles in the

development of relevant policy documents for the water sector in Ghana. Prior to this, he had worked with the Hydrological Service Department in Ghana. Mr. Aboagye is a member of the Ghana Institution of Engineers.



Vida Duti (Mrs.) is IRC's Ghana Country Director. Prior to that she was Country Coordinator for Triple-S (Sustainable Services at Scale) Project. She had also worked as a Development Officer at CIDA. Mrs. Duti has interfaced

with stakeholders at varied levels in the water sector in Ghana and understands Ghana's local governance structure and capacity building issues. She holds among others, a Master's degree in Regional Development Planning and Management from the University of Dortmund, Germany.

At the Water Research Institute, he undertook research in the areas of surface and groundwater hydrology, water resources planning and management, and integrated water resources management. He has published widely in many local and international journals. He is a member of several local and international bodies. He is a Council member of both the Ghana Institution of Engineers (GhIE) and the University for Development Studies, Ghana. He is also the former Chief Executive Officer of the Community Water and Sanitation Agency.
